REPORT ON STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTATIVE TOWNHALL MEETING FOR KANO STATE PROPOSED 2022 BUDGET AT RANO EMIRATE COUNCIL HELD ON 3RD OCTOBER, 2021

Background

The Kano Budget Working Group (KBWG) with support from Kano State Ministry of Planning and Budget and PERL organized a two-day (2nd & 3rd October, 2021) public consultative town hall meeting as part of the Kano state mandate in embracing reforms towards inclusive budget process through strengthening citizens' participation right from budget formulation to implementation.

One of the aims of the meeting was to inform, consult and generate demands from participants as citizens input in the ongoing preparatory stage of 2022 budget process.

The participants were drawn from Community Based Organizations, Traditional and religious leaders, trade union, People with disabilities, women and youth groups, media as well as representatives of Rano local government, academia from the 10 Local Government Areas under Rano Emirate Council namely Bunkure, Rano, Bebeji, Doguwa, Sumaila, Takai, Kura, Kibiya, Garun Malam, and Tudun Wada.

Representatives of Kano State Ministry of Planning and Budget were also at the event.

Presentation

Awaisu Garun Malam served as the Master of the meeting.

The meeting commenced by a prayer from Malam Umar Aliyu (a Volunteer) and followed by self-introduction each of the participants

Opening remarks/stating the objective of the gathering was chaired by Sagir Salihu Chedi (A member of KBWG).

In his remarks Chedi thanked the participants for honouring the invitation despite their tied schedules. He stated the objectives of the meeting as follows:

- i. To inform the participants on the importance of citizens participation and involvement in the preparation of Kano State 2022 proposed budget
- ii. To seek for the citizens' demand for inclusion in the state budget
- iii. To ensure continue engagement between government and citizens' group and to re-emphasis the importance of knowing and understanding budget processes from formulation, implementation, monitoring and tracking of the budget as well as audit report.

A representative from the state Ministry of Planning and Bugdet, Auwalu Ibrahim Soron Dinki stressed the need for citizen participation in the budget process.

He urged participants to follow-up with projects allocated for their communities in the budget.

Other members of KBWG that spoke at the event include Isiyaku Ahmad, Abdussalam Muhammad Kani, Umar Saleh Anka, Awaisu Garun Malam and Hajiya Rabi Gezawa.

The Citizens' nominated project captured for Rano Emirate Council in the Citizens Accountability Report was presented to all the representatives from the 10 LGAs. There was no objection of the projects but the CBOs demanded additional projects.

LGAs that were not captured in CAR report gave fresh demands for inclusion into the 2022 budget.

Citizens' Inputs/demand generated during the meeting

Observations made by the participants

Makiru Adamu Kibiya of Kibiya Youth Concern Forum observed that much of the demands by CBOs in the last exercise was not captured in the budget and they are face with another round of generating demands. He demanded explanation.

Isiyaku Ahmed responded that it could be that the project demanded by the citizens was high above the ceiling budget for citizens' project.

Ismaila Musa Tudunwada representing Promoting Literacy in Tudunwada observed that when they track uncompleted projects and submit reports to Local Government Secretariat, action is not taken. He also sensitization on how CBOs can push their demand to logical conclusion.

Isiyaku Ahmed enlightened participants on the processes of tracking projects and where to forward the report of the tracking. The Garun Malam experience was used as case study

Success story

Yakubu Murtala of Garun Malam Concern Forum gave a short presentation of how his CBO tracked the uncompleted construction of Government Girls Junior Secondary School, Dorowar Sallau, Garun Malam.

They submitted their report to the legislator who presented their findings at the State House of Assembly. The project has now been completed and the school is in use.

Lessons learnt

1. The participants were excited for the continues involvement in the budget process. Most of them made instant commitments to make their input ready before townhall meeting and submit copies of the analyzed citizens' input to the legislators representing their LGA.
2. The level of CBOs commitment is high with regards to the budget engagement process; this is new and commendable.
3. The CBOs have the zeal passion to engage the budget process but most of them do not have the capacity required as such they are limited to a part of the formation and tracking process.

The participants made promises to step down what they learnt to other members and even cascade it to other CBOs in their community.

The meeting ended by 1:30pm with a closing prayer from a volunteer

Sustainability

To own the process, there should be a deliberate workshop and mentoring of CBO on how to adopt the template if need to be and when to administer it.

However, they were taught how to generate and analyze demands from their communities
